## February 22, 2017

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Law Library Trustees of Los Angeles County was held on Wednesday, February 22, 2017 at 12:15 p.m., at the Los Angeles County Law Library Mildred L. Lillie Main Library Building at 301 West First Street, Los Angeles, California 90012 for the purposes of considering reports of the affairs to the Library, and transacting such other business as might properly come before the Board of Trustees.

President Jones determined a quorum to be present, convened the meeting at 12:22 p.m. and thereafter presided. Senior Director, Jaye Steinbrick recorded the Minutes.

## 1.0 PUBLIC COMMENT

One public comment made from Mr. Lee Paradise regarding prior Executive Director of the LA Law Library in association with depleted resources and spending habits.

## 2.0 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Jones commented on the anticipated Beacon of Justice Gala. The 2017 honoree will be Justice Collins. President Jones expressed excitement towards participating in the event and in honoring Justice Collins. President Jones also thanked Senior Director Jaye Steinbrick for sitting in on the month's meeting due to the absence of Executive Director, Sandra J. Levin. President Jones expressed appreciation for the many roles SD Steinbrick fills at LA Law Library.

President Jones requested a motion to approve the Consent Calendar. So moved by Trustee Juhas, seconded by Trustee Klein. The motion was unanimously approved, 5-0.

## 4.0 DISCUSSION ITEMS

4.1 Approval of Workers Compensation Renewal Package

Finance Manager, Marcelino Juarez clarified and answered questions from the Board of Trustees regarding the adjusted fees and costs. FM Juarez noted that ex-mod has been reduced due to the lowered count of Workers Compensation claims in the past year thus resulting in the ability to acquire multiple bids. President Jones added that the lower count of claims reflects the LA Law Library and the safety experience from all staff. SD Steinbrick also added that the LA Law Library will be welcoming a Workers Comp speaker to give an orientation on safety practices for staff.

President Jones requested a motion on Discussion Item 4.1 to approve the Workers Compensation Renewal Package effective March 1, 2017. So moved by Trustee Juhas, seconded by Trustee Landin. The motion was unanimously approved, 6-0.

## 4.2 Patron Services Presentation

Patron Services Director, Malinda Muller, Senior Librarian of Reference & Research, Austin Stoub, Managing Librarian, Ryan Metheny, Senior Librarian of Collection & Branches, Linda Heichman, Global Law Librarian, Sarah Sullivan, and Public Interest & Self Represented Librarian, Janine Liebert all spoke before the Board regarding their role and overall goals within the new structure of the Patron Services Department. Sr. Librarian Stoub is in charge of organizing coverage at reference counter, acts as supervisor to other librarians, responsible for digital services and displays along with other reference librarians. Managing Librarian Metheny is responsible for over 300 classes expected over the course of the year. Trustee Juhas expressed interest and enthusiasm in bringing in more JH and HS students, creating more patron diversity and reaching out to the community in non-traditional ways. Sr. Librarian Heichman reported her responsibilities in working closely with

the collection, price trends and looking ahead for further collection development. President Jones added her interest in being kept up to date with collection developments as it allows the Board to comprehend trends of the library. Trustee Steinhauser commented on the demands of materials in other languages. Trustee Steinhauser is also interested in understanding the dynamic of print vs. electronic. Global Law Librarian Sullivan introduced herself as the newest librarian and reported on her effort to identify the strengths and weaknesses of the foreign collection. Trustee Klein added the possibility of increasing fees to law firms who would utilize foreign materials. Managing Librarian Liebert spoke in regards to the continuing expansion of partnerships and clinics in legal services.

#### **SUMMARY AND INTRODUCTION**

The proposed Federal budget recently presented by the President would eliminate all funding for the Legal Services Corporation (LSC). This would impact the Law Library in several ways, discussed here.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The first step in the federal budget process is the presentation of a proposed budget by the President. (This is followed by congressional budget resolutions and appropriations bills.) In this initial step, the budget as proposed would eliminate LSC entirely.

Established by Congress in 1974, LSC funds civil legal assistance for low-income Americans. LSC is the largest single funder of civil legal aid in the country. LSC is essentially a grant-making organization, distributing more than 90% of its federal appropriation to eligible nonprofits delivering civil legal aid throughout the country. LSC's grantees serve low-income individuals, veterans, children, families, and seniors in every congressional district, addressing matters involving safety, subsistence, and family stability.

LA Law Library does not receive any direct funding from LSC. In Los Angeles County, the three LSC funded organizations are the Legal Aid Foundation of Los Angeles (LAFLA), Neighborhood Legal Services (NLS) and the Legal Aid Society of Orange County (LASOC). LA Law Library has partnered with each of these organizations in the past and has a number of significant, ongoing programs as well.

Fundamentally, the elimination of LSC would likely have two types of impacts on LA Law Library. First, we would expect an increased demand for assistance, as those who currently receive assistance from LSC funded organizations may no longer be able to receive assistance from legal aid organizations. Second, programs currently hosted by LA Law Library and presented by LSC funded organizations may be eliminated. In particular, the following programs rely upon LSC funded organizations:

volunteer opportunities for incubator participants)

Law Week

Expungement clinic, volunteer training re expungements, class on social security and class on Section 8 and Subsidized Housing –LAFLA Expungement eligibility/screening workshop at the Lancaster Public Library–NLS

Pro Bono Week

Booth, trainings for the legal community and classes for the public -- LAFLA Public classes (2016 was on service abroad under the Hague Convention) and booth, trainings for the legal community and class for the public in years past – NLS

Note that the federal budget also proposes to eliminate funding for the Institute of Museum and Library Services which provides funding for general public libraries, including California's public library system. LA Law Library receives no IMLS funding. The proposed diminution in funding for general public libraries could potentially cause some increase in usage at LA Law Library, but it is less likely to have a direct or significant impact on the Law Library.

## Statement of ABA President re: Eliminated Funding for the Legal Services Corporation

WASHINGTON, March, 16, 2017 - The American Bar Association is outraged that the administration proposes to eliminate funding for the Legal Services Corporation in its budget and calls on every member of Congress to restore full funding. LSC provides civil legal aid to people who desperately need help to navigate the legal process. Without this assistance, court house doors will slam in the faces of millions of Americans, denying them equal access to justice.

Some of the worthy services the LSC provides include securing housing for veterans, protecting seniors from scams, delivering legal services to rural areas, protecting victims of domestic abuse and helping disaster survivors. Their offices are in every congressional district and they help almost 1.9 million people annually.

More than 30 cost-benefit studies all show that legal aid delivers far more in benefits than it costs. If veterans become homeless, or disaster victims cannot rebuild, their costs to society are significantly more.

LSC has had bipartisan support in Congress since its inception in 1974 because it embodies the principles that for two centuries have defined us as Americans – fairness and equal access to justice. These principles should be for all people regardless of economic status. As the budget process proceeds, the ABA will be working to ensure that Congress provides adequate funding for LSC. It is cost-effective, beneficial to millions of Americans and the right thing to do for our country.
